Just a Note on Family Dinnertime

It was just about 5 o'clock when our Mom called out to us, "Girls! Set the table!" From our bedroom, my sister Lynda and I yelled back, "Okay ... in a minute!" Um ... in a minute? We quickly realized that was a big mistake when we saw our Mom moments later at our bedroom door, hands on her hips, and not saying a word. No, instead she stared us down with The Mom Look ... a Look she mastered as soon as we started to walk. And if she gave you that Look, you moved! Or stopped in your tracks! Whichever applied.

Dad soon walked in through the door announcing, "I'm starving — what smells so good?" Now I loved my mother, but truth be told she was <u>not</u> the best cook on the block — her food always smelled MUCH better than it tasted. But be-that-as-it-may, every night on our kitchen table, there was a big bowl of green vegetables, as well as a starch (usually mashed potatoes) and a meager platter of meat. We were never financially comfortable, but Mom managed to put a well-balanced dinner and three big glasses of milk on the table every night for us. I also want to mention that everyone in my family was a Fast Eater, except for me, who was The Poor Eater and extremely slow at finishing a meal. Honestly, every night I felt like I was watching the Annual Nathan's Coney Island Hot Dog Eating Contest at my house! And at the end of our meal, Mom would always ask, "Isn't anyone going to eat anything else?" One by one, we'd say that we couldn't eat another bite - but no one left their seat, because each of us had a voice that wanted to be heard during our family dinnertime conversations.

Eddie first that night; "Can you take me down to Catherine E. Doyle field this Saturday for Pop Warner tryouts? And can you pass the potatoes?" As Dad passed the bowl he inquired, "What position are you trying out for and who's coaching this year?" And their chat continued.

Lynda chimed in next making the announcement; "I think I'm going to bleach my hair blonde - and I'm not hungry but I'll just pick on that leftover chicken leg. Want to pass that over here?"

Mom's answer to Lynda; "You're not bleaching anything except your towels, sweetheart! Okay, who else wants more chicken?"

My turn at bat; "I'll take some more potatoes! Hey, can I bleach MY hair blonde if Lynda does?" "ABSOLUTELY NOT! Now see what you started. Your sister wants to bleach HER hair! NO ONE IS BLEACHING THEIR HAIR!" Mom insisted, thinking she put an end to that debate.

"But Mom - you do!" Gulp! Yup, I regretted those the words the second after I said them, and as a diversion I quickly said, "Can I have some more peas, too?" (The Poor Eater asking for food was always a great diversion.) It wasn't long before there wasn't much food left on the table — we'd been talking and 'picking' for almost an hour.

Family dinnertime - a ritual that went on for centuries, and sadly, has diminished due to sports, work schedules, and other commitments. Take-out and Drive-ups have replaced the family dinnertime around the table, and even when the family IS together, there doesn't seem to be any conversation. All too often, heads are down, and thumbs are racing across cellphone screens sending text messages or playing games. Regrettably, I once commented on this and was told that it's a *generational thing* and that *I don't understand progress*. That was a reality check for me – I'm THEIR older generation!

Then I recalled how my parents, MY older generation, reacted decades ago to my going out to a Club on a Friday night at 10 PM - "You know, WE never went out that late!". Or the first time I wore a miniskirt - "You know, your grandparents would never let me out of the house wearing that!." Or when my voice was heard during dinnertime conversations - "You know, I remember your grandparents never allowed talking at the dinner."

I know - and thanks for the reminder that EVERY generation has its own generational thing.

Sudoku requires no calculation or arithmetic skills. It is essentially a game of placing numbers in squares, using very simple rules of logic and deduction.

The objective of the game is to fill all the blank squares in a game with the correct numbers. There are three very simple constraints to follow. In a 9 by 9 square Sudoku game:

- Every row of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every column of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every 3 by 3 subsection of the 9 by 9 square must include all digits 1 through 9

Every Sudoku games begins with a number of squares already filled in, and the difficulty of each game is largely a function of how many squares are filled in. The more squares that are known, the easier it is to figure out which numbers go in the open squares. As you fill in squares correctly, options for the remaining squares are narrowed and it becomes easier to fill them in.

Just a Note Encore "Hear Ye, Hear Ye!"

Three men with hearing aids are walking down the street. One of them says, "It's windy today, isn't it?" The second man responds, "No, it's Thursday, you idiot!" The last one says, "Me, too, let's get a drink."

I took a flight to visit my cousins in 2017, unbeknownst to me, with an inner ear infection in my left ear. It was hours after I arrived at my destination, and I was still unable to hear anything clearly in my left ear. I chalked it up to cabin pressure. You know, when your ears clog up and you hold your nose and blow to make them 'pop' open. Only mine didn't 'pop'.

Months following, I had an MRI and went to three different Ear, Nose & Throat specialists, who gave me a variety of medications – none of which helped me to regain the hearing I had lost.

During the year that followed, like those three men,

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
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it was only a few words that I was "misunderstanding". It really wasn't enough for me, or anyone else, to realize that I had severe hearing loss in my left ear. Or so I thought. I'll never forget the day I realized I needed to do something more about my hearing loss -

It was Autumn when I was watching my greatnephews, Vance and Charlie. We were playing *Trains* when Vance asked me a question as he turned away to pick up a toy. I didn't hear what he said, and he looked back at me, waiting for my response. That was my defining moment when I realized I needed to see an Audiologist about getting a hearing aid - and it was one of the best and smartest things I've ever done for myself.

I learned from my Audiologist the potential health impacts from untreated hearing loss can lead to increased blood pressure levels, depression, fatigue, social withdrawal, and impaired memory (dementia). I saw many of those symptoms during the last year of my husband's life - I didn't know that they were probably related to his obvious hearing loss. "Another piece of the puzzle" A piece I'm hoping helps someone who reads this.

That Thanksgiving, after I got my hearing aid, I was blessed to share the day with my niece Brooke and her family. Double blessed when Charlie hugged me and whispered "I love you, Auntie" ... and I heard every word clearly!

Silver Ridge Park North Shed Rules

After discussion regarding sheds at the Silver Ridge Park North (SRPN) Trustee meeting, held on Tuesday, April 7, 2015, the Trustees unanimously agreed to Rules 1-8. Updated Permit/Form information - February 2019.

- 1. In keeping with Berkeley Township's Shed Ordinance, homeowners are permitted, effective this date, to install one (1) shed on their property; up to and including 120 square feet (10 ft. x 12 ft.):
- 2. Said shed may be of any structure material the homeowner desires;
- 3. Sheds that are required to be fastened must be on a firm ground structure. DO NOT place any shed on a cement slab. Cement slabs add square feet to your taxable living space and will be taxable by Berkeley Township;

- 4. Sheds may NOT be installed on any Common Ground Property;
- 5. In accordance with Berkeley Township Ordinance, sheds must be placed at least three (3) feet from the back property line and at least (3) feet from the side property line;
- 6. If a homeowner chooses to install a shed adjacent to their home, it may NOT block any windows or
- 7. Homeowners MUST submit an Architectural Approval Request form to the SRPN Architectural Committee. Architectural Approval Request forms are available in the SRPN Clubhouse Lobby;
- 8. The homeowner MUST submit a **Zoning Permit** Application, required fees, and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall/Zoning Office. Zoning Permit Application forms can be obtained from the Berkeley Township Website or Zoning Office.

OCEAN RIDE ~ Reserve-A-Ride Program

Ocean County Transportation Services Department

Seniors (age 60 and over) and/or persons with disabilities (age 18 and over) on an advanced reservation basis primarily to destinations within Ocean County. **Pre-registration is NOT required, just call us when you need your appointment.**

You may call Ocean Ride Monday through Friday only, from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM to make your trip reservation. We accept trip reservations on a first-come, first serve basis, up to (4) four weeks in advance. All trip requests are to be handled by telephone by calling (732) 736-8989, then press "1" to speak with a Reservationist.

The Reserve-A-Ride program is primarily designed to serve routine medical needs of Ocean County residents. Unlike the Fixed Bus Routes, this service does not operate on the basis of a printed schedule, rather routes and pick-up times are developed each day in response to the service requests we receive. All vehicles are wheelchair lift equipped.

Once your reservation has been made, the driver will arrive anytime within 1 hour to 1½ hours of the scheduled appointment time (depending on your travel distance). In accordance with Ocean Ride's Safety Policy, our Drivers are NOT permitted to enter your home, thus we require that you be at ground level for your scheduled pick up.

Riders will be billed via mail, the month AFTER service.

Absolutely NO CASH HANDLING on-board the Reserve-A-Ride vehicles.

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Prior to obtaining a permit from the Berkeley Township Construction Office and/or Zoning Office, homeowners must obtain a "Architectural Approval Request " form from the Architectural Committee. Sheds, upgrades, renovations, repairs, additions, exterior changes, anything pertain to the grounds, trees, driveway construction and sidewalks all require approval from the Architectural Committee. Note: Homeowners may need to submit a Zoning Permit Application, required fees, and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall/Zoning Office. Contact the Zoning Office for instructions.

COMMON GROUNDS

No debris, grass cuttings, landscape material, leaves, old plants, tree branches should be dumped in the common grounds. Violators are subject to Berkeley Township fines.

LAWS GOVERNING S R P NORTH

Mandatory Federal, NJ State, Berkeley Township Laws, SRPN Association Covenant-Restrictions and By-Laws and Robert Rules are instruments of the rule of law that the sitting Board of Trustees must follow to meet their obligations.

- Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (Federal Fair Housing Act)
- . The Housing for Older Persons Act (HOPA)
- NJ State Public Law #L90-284 and PUB 100L430 Guidelines for the operation of senior communities.
- Berkeley Township Ordinance #118-1625. The establishment of a planned residential community for older adults.
 Silver Ridge Park North's Covenants and Restrictions/By-Laws.
- State of New Jersey Full Disclosure Act and Regulations Title #5.

SELLING/RENTING OF HOMES

When selling your home, either on your own or through a Real Estate Agent, you must notify the HOA <u>BEFORE</u> your buyer completes the 'New Purchaser's Packet' and provide the HOA with two (2) forms of identification; one being a photo ID showing birthdates for <u>each occupant</u> of the home. (See pg.2 for appt. information) SRPN By-Laws require one (1) year homeowner's ownership prior to renting their property.

Landlords AND Tenants must complete the HOA's 'Lease Agreement Packet' and provide the HOA with two (2) forms of identification; one being a photo I.D. showing birthdates for each occupant <u>and</u> a copy of the Lease.

All buyers and tenants (all residents) must appear <u>in</u> <u>person</u> at the HOA office with the required identification and paperwork. Berkeley Township will not issue a C.O. (Certificate of Occupancy) without the HOA's Letter stating the buyer/tenants are in good standing with the Homeowners Association.

SIDEWALKS

It is each homeowner's responsibility to repair and maintain sidewalks on their property. All lifted and cracked sidewalks require repair at the homeowner's expense.

TREES

It is the homeowner's responsibility to prune and maintain trees located on their property. Also, no tree in the common ground, or wildlife corridor, may be pruned, removed, or topped for any purpose, including installation of solar panels. Trees in these areas needing attention should be brought to the attention of the Common Ground Trees Committee.

OTHER IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Parking/storage of inoperable, unregistered, or uninsured motor vehicles, boats, or any other watercrafts, trailers, and/or recreational vehicles are not allowed anywhere on your property or Common Grounds.
- Berkeley Township Ordinance: Trash/garbage
 is to be put out at the curb <u>AFTER 4:00pm</u> on
 the day before a scheduled pickup. RECYCLED
 ITEMS are to be placed curbside, in reusable
 containers or <u>paper</u> bags, <u>AFTER 5:00pm</u> on
 the day before a scheduled pick up.
- All pets are required to be leashed. You must pick up and remove your pet's waste, even if you walk them in the common ground area.
- It is the Homeowner's responsibility to maintain their grass and/or stone lawns.
- A Berkeley Township Ordinance strictly prohibits the feeding of wild animals consisting of, but not limiting to, the following: DEER, rabbits, squirrels, chipmunks, and groundhogs. Wild birds are excluded.

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
