



The site is not new but has made many improvements over the previous years.

The NJ State tax return can also be filed from the site for a small fee. But you do not have to use the service. If you filed a NJ tax return in the previous year, go to the NJ taxation website and you can file your state tax return for free.

These free filing programs are certainly worth investigating, especially when tax preparers are charging \$100+ to file simple returns.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION S R P NORTH HOMEOWNERS

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Prior to obtaining a permit from the Berkeley Township Construction Office and/or Zoning Office, homeowners must obtain a "Architectural Approval Request " form from the Architectural Committee. Sheds, upgrades, renovations, repairs, additions, exterior changes, anything pertain to the grounds, trees, driveway construction and sidewalks all require approval from the Architectural Committee. Note: Homeowners may need to submit a Zoning Permit Application, required fees, and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall/Zoning Office. Contact the Zoning Office for instructions.

COMMON GROUNDS

No debris, grass cuttings, landscape material, leaves, old plants, tree branches should be dumped in the common grounds. Violators are subject to Berkeley Township fines.

LAWS GOVERNING S R P NORTH

Mandatory Federal, NJ State, Berkeley Township Laws, SRPN Association Covenant-Restrictions and By-Laws and Robert Rules are instruments of the rule of law that the sitting Board of Trustees must follow to meet their obligations.

- Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (Federal Fair Housing Act)
- The Housing for Older Persons Act (HOPA)
- NJ State Public Law #L90-284 and PUB 100L430 Guidelines for the operation of senior communities.
- Berkeley Township Ordinance #118-1625. The establishment of a planned residential community for older adults.
 Silver Ridge Park North's Covenants and Restrictions/By-Laws.
- State of New Jersey Full Disclosure Act and Regulations Title #5.

SELLING/RENTING OF HOMES

When selling your home, either on your own or through a Real Estate Agent, you must notify the HOA <u>BEFORE</u> your buyer completes the 'New Purchaser's Packet' and provide the HOA with two (2) forms of identification; one being a photo ID showing birthdates for <u>each occupant</u> of the home. (See pg.2 for appt. information) SRPN By-Laws require one (1) year homeowner's ownership prior to renting their property.

Landlords AND Tenants must complete the HOA's 'Lease Agreement Packet' and provide the HOA with two (2) forms of identification; one being a photo I.D. showing birthdates for each occupant <u>and</u> a copy of the Lease.

All buyers and tenants (all residents) must appear <u>in</u> <u>person</u> at the HOA office with the required identification and paperwork. Berkeley Township will not issue a C.O. (Certificate of Occupancy) without the HOA's Letter stating the buyer/tenants are in good standing with the Homeowners Association.

SIDEWALKS

It is each homeowner's responsibility to repair and maintain sidewalks on their property. All lifted and cracked sidewalks require repair at the homeowner's expense.

TREES

It is the homeowner's responsibility to prune and maintain trees located on their property. Also, no tree in the common ground, or wildlife corridor, may be pruned, removed, or topped for any purpose, including installation of solar panels. Trees in these areas needing attention should be brought to the attention of the Common Ground Trees Committee.

OTHER IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Parking/storage of inoperable, unregistered, or uninsured motor vehicles, boats, or any other watercrafts, trailers, and/or recreational vehicles are not allowed anywhere on your property or Common Grounds.
- Berkeley Township Ordinance: Trash/garbage
 is to be put out at the curb <u>AFTER 4:00pm</u> on
 the day before a scheduled pickup. RECYCLED
 ITEMS are to be placed curbside, in reusable
 containers or <u>paper</u> bags, <u>AFTER 5:00pm</u> on
 the day before a scheduled pick up.
- All pets are required to be leashed. You must pick up and remove your pet's waste, even if you walk them in the common ground area.
- It is the Homeowner's responsibility to maintain their grass and/or stone lawns.
- A Berkeley Township Ordinance strictly prohibits the feeding of wild animals consisting of, but not limiting to, the following: DEER, rabbits, squirrels, chipmunks, and groundhogs. Wild birds are excluded.

Just A Note

Our Old House

It was May of 1961 when my family packed up our belongings and moved to Florida for a brief time. I was nine years old, in the fourth grade, and before the Chevy left the front of our home, I was already missing our childhood home. We lived in Lyndhurst in a two-story home with a big, beautiful staircase that boasted a heavy colonial banister. So many times, Eddie, my younger brother, and I would slide down that banister with my mother's voice echoing in the background, "Knock it off! Someone's going to break a leg!" I don't know where the heck my mother got her predictions from -- thank goodness she was no Jeanne Dixon because we never broke anything sliding down that banister. But, her threats were enough to make us stop ... for the day, anyway.

We had a great backyard, with an elevated deck off our kitchen. My grandfather actually built the deck BEFORE replacing the window with a door to access it. Until the door was installed, we'd have to climb out the window to get onto the deck. I remember seeing my mother drop the wash basket, full of wet laundry, out the window onto the deck, then climb through the window to hang them on the clothes line. My siblings and I also used the clothes line, but not to hang laundry. Lynda, my older sister, and I would throw a rope over the clothes line and tie it around Eddie's waist, creating a Zip Line. We'd push him off the railing of the deck to see how far he'd go across the backyard. Each time, Eddie held his little legs out in front of him and pushed himself off the metal pole at the end of the clothes line. Well, not "each time" – the last time we launched Eddie, he forgot to put his feet up. Again, we heard my mother's voice, "Knock it off! You're going to kill your brother!" Realizing she could be right, we thought it best to look for other ways to entertain ourselves. And so, we did ...

There was an archway between the dining room and living room where my parents hung a long set of drapes that divided the two rooms. It was the perfect backdrop for the "shows" we'd put on whenever relatives came over to visit. Lynda, and our cousin Candy, wrote an opening song that we used for every show (I still remember the words and tune). I would be the first act -- telling jokes I heard from the Steve Allen Show the week before. Then Lynda and Candy would come out to sing a song together ("Pennies From Heaven" comes to mind). I was up again, this time doing my imitations (I did a great Ethel Merman singing "Everything's Coming Up Roses"). Our closing act was some form of acrobatics – usually involving a hula-hoop. Our parents and relatives were always gracious and encouraging by applauding and laughing in all the right places.

Flashforward to a day in the 1990's - Lynda and I took a "memory lane" ride through Lyndhurst to see our old stomping grounds. We stopped at our grammar school (Roosevelt School) where we were welcomed to walk through the halls. Nothing had changed - not even the color of the walls. We then drove to our old house anticipating the same unchanging results. Thankfully, we had our memories of growing up in our old house during the 1950's because were we ever wrong:

"Hmm. I kind of like the new color of the house, but the new front door - not too much."

"Aw, look. They cut down that beautiful tree that was next to our bedroom window."

"Huh. I remember the backyard being so much bigger, don't you?"

"Oh man! The Zip Line's gone, too!? Hey, remember how we use to launch Eddie ..."

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You may call Ocean Ride Monday through Friday only, from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM to make your trip reservation. We accept trip reservations on a first-come, first serve basis, up to (4) four weeks in advance. All trip requests are to be handled by telephone by calling (732) 736-8989, then press "1" to speak with a Reservationist.

The Reserve-A-Ride program is primarily designed to serve routine medical needs of Ocean County residents. Unlike the Fixed Bus Routes, this service does not operate on the basis of a printed schedule, rather routes and pick-up times are developed each day in response to the service requests we receive. All vehicles are wheelchair lift equipped.

Once your reservation has been made, the driver will arrive anytime within 1 hour to 1½ hours of the scheduled appointment time (depending on your travel distance). In accordance with Ocean Ride's Safety Policy, our Drivers are NOT permitted to enter your home, thus we require that you be at ground level for your scheduled pick up.

Riders will be billed via mail, the month AFTER service.

Absolutely NO CASH HANDLING on-board the Reserve-A-Ride vehicles.

Frequently Asked Questions

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF MOVING TO AUTOMATED TRASH COLLECTION?

Automation is a faster and a more efficient way to collect residential solid waste. Additionally, other towns that have moved to automated collection have reported an increase in recycling rates and an overall reduction in the amount of trash collected. The hinged lids help to keep rainwater out of the cans, reduce trash weight, and are animal-proof as well. In addition to anticipated time and cost savings, the program will help keep our neighborhoods neat and clean, improve safety on residential streets, and provide safer working conditions for trash collectors. Cans are durable and easy to maneuver.

WILL CURRENT EMPLOYEES LOSE THEIR JOBS?

NO! This plan is not in place to lay off any public works employees.

IS THERE A COST FOR THE NEW CANS?

Your first trash and recycling cans are free. There will be a cost to purchase any additional cans.

WHAT ARE THE SIZES OF THE NEW CANS?

Berkeley Township is offering one (1) sixty-five (65) gallon trash and one (1) sixty-five (65)-gallon recycling can. Residents may request a ninety-five (95) gallon can in advance. Please note a sixty-five (65) gallon can holds 4-5 tall kitchen trash bags and a ninety-five (95) gallon can hold 7-8 tall kitchen trash bags.

CAN I ORDER ADDITIONAL CANS?

For an additional cost you may purchase up to one (1) more trash and or recycling can

WHEN WILL WE RECEIVE OUR NEW CANS?

Cans will be delivered to every home within Holiday City sometime after the new year. Appointments are not necessary, and you do not need to be home to receive your new trash can. If you travel during the winter, you may call the public works office at 732-349-4616 and put your trash can delivery on hold.

WHEN WILL THE AUTOMATED COLLECTION BEGIN?

You may start using your new can once it's delivered to you.

WHAT DO THE NEW CANS LOOK LIKE?

Berkeley Township has selected Burgundy, 65-gallon trash cans and Blue 65-gallon recycling cans. These cans will help to keep our residential streets neat and clean. All trash cans will have the Township logo on the side and will be linked to your address via a serial number embedded in the plastic.

CAN I USE THE CAN I ALREADY HAVE?

No. Only those cans provided by the Township will be collected. Cans other than those provided by the township will not be collected.

WHAT DO I DO WITH MY CAN IF I MOVE?

Trash/Recycling Cans are issued and owned by the Township and must remain at the property address to which they are assigned.

THE NEW CANS LOOK BIG. ARE THEY EASY TO WHEEL TO AND FROM THE CURB?

New Trash & Recycling cans are designed for weight distribution and safety. They are easy to maneuver empty and full. Most importantly they are senior friendly and roll easily on all types of terrain.

WHAT DO I DO WITH MY OLD TRASH CAN?

You may leave your old can at the curb, and it will be disposed of for you by the Department of Public Works.

ARE THE NEW CANS ANIMAL PROOF?

The new cans are the most animal proof available. If you store your can outside and encounter a problem with animals, you can use a bungee cord to secure the lid to the lift bar, but please remember to remove the bungee cord on your collection day or your can will not be emptied.

WILL MY COLLECTION DAY REMAIN THE SAME?

Yes. Your trash will continue to be collected weekly, and on the same collection day. Trash & Recycling cans are to be placed at the curb no earlier than the evening prior and no later than 6 am of your collection day.

WHAT IF MY CAN GETS DAMAGED?

Contact the Department of Public Works at (732) 349-4616 to report a damaged can.

WHAT SHOULD I DO WITH OVERFLOW TRASH THAT DOES NOT FIT INTO MY CAN?

Your new trash can accommodate as much volume as 2 to 3 standard-sized trash cans. We expect these cans to be sufficient for your household needs. If you have a one-time overflow of trash, please hold it until your next regular collection day or drop it off at the Ocean County Landfill. If you continue to have an overflow of trash or recycling, a second can should be purchased.

WILL I STILL RECEIVE BULK COLLECTION

Bulk Collection will be scheduled on an as needed basis. If you have items to put out for bulk, you may call the public works office at 732-349-4616 and schedule your bulk pick up.

HOW DO I PREPARE MY TRASH CAN FOR WEEKLY SET-OUT?

All trash must be bagged before being placed in the can. The lid to the can must close tightly. Your cans should be free of any obstacle such as mailboxes, telephone poles, vehicles, and any overhead obstructions. The can's handle and wheels are to face the house. The lids opening is to face the street. No material is to be sticking out of the can. Trash and recycling cans are to be placed at the curb approximately three (3) feet apart from each other, and at least four (4) feet from any other obstacle.

WHAT IF I AM DISABLED?

Our disabled residents must provide a prescription provided by your doctor stating you are disabled and cannot walk your trash and recycling cans to the curb. Once we receive this prescription a team member from public works will bring your can to the curb to be emptied. Prescriptions must be renewed yearly and received by January 31. Extensions may be granted by calling the public works office.

WHAT HAPPENS IF MY COLLECTION DAY FALLS ON A HOLIDAY?

If your trash/recycling collection falls on a Holiday it will be delayed one (1) day. If your trash is not picked up, please leave it at the curb for the next day until the department catches up. The departments' goal is to be back on track within 24-48 hours of the holiday.

ARE THERE ANY ITEMS NOT PERMITTED FOR TRASH COLLECTION?

Recyclables

Yard Waste such as leaves, grass clippings, and brush.

Hot ash from fireplace or fire pits

Any other hazardous, flammable, combustible materials: such as oil-based paints, solvents, asbestos, or commercial medical waste.

WHAT GOES IN MY RECYCLING CAN?

Loose Recyclable Plastics #1,2,5 (Lids and caps can be left on) Glass Bottles, Jars and Containers Aluminum, Steel, Tin, and Bi-Metal Cans Paper, Cardboard, Newspapers, Magazines ALL BOTTLES AND CANS SHOULD BE RINSED

WHAT IS NOT ALLOWED IN MY RECYCLING CAN?

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
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
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
