



SPRING TURN ON & FALL WINTERIZATION



Spring Turn-ons

- Turn water on to system
- Customize clock's watering schedules for each zone to meet your specific needs
- Adjust heads for proper water coverage
- Check backflow/well for any winter damage
- Check for any leaks
- Inspect rain sensor



Fall Winterizations

- Turn off water supply to sprinkler system
- Disconnect power to sprinkler clock
- Disconnect power to well pump
- Properly blow out well pump/backflow
- Blow out sprinkler lines

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

S R P NORTH HOMEOWNERS

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Prior to obtaining a permit from the Berkeley Township Construction Office and/or Zoning Office, homeowners must obtain a "Architectural Approval Request" form from the *Architectural Committee*. **Sheds, upgrades, renovations, repairs, additions, exterior changes, anything pertain to the grounds, trees, driveway construction and sidewalks all require approval from the Architectural Committee.** **Note:** Homeowners may need to submit a Zoning Permit Application, required fees, and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall/Zoning Office. Contact the Zoning Office for instructions.

COMMON GROUNDS

No debris, grass cuttings, landscape material, leaves, old plants, tree branches should be dumped in the common grounds. **Violators are subject to Berkeley Township fines.**

LAWS GOVERNING S R P NORTH

Mandatory Federal, NJ State, Berkeley Township Laws, SRPN Association Covenant-Restrictions and By-Laws and Robert Rules are instruments of the rule of law that the sitting Board of Trustees must follow to meet their obligations.

- State of New Jersey Full Disclosure Act and Regulations Title #5.

SELLING/RENTING OF HOMES

When selling your home, either on your own or through a Real Estate Agent, you must notify the HOA **BEFORE** your buyer completes the 'New Purchaser's Packet' and provide the HOA with two (2) forms of identification; one being a photo ID showing birthdates for each occupant of the home. (See pg.2 for appt. information) **SRPN By-Laws require one (1) year homeowner's ownership prior to renting their property.**

Landlords AND Tenants must complete the HOA's 'Lease Agreement Packet' and provide the HOA with two (2) forms of identification; one being a photo I.D. showing birthdates for **each occupant and a copy of the Lease.**

All buyers and tenants (all residents) **must appear in person** at the HOA office with the required identification and paperwork. **Berkeley Township will not issue a C.O. (Certificate of Occupancy) without the HOA's Letter stating the buyer/tenants are in good standing with the Homeowners Association.**

SIDEWALKS

It is each homeowner's responsibility to repair and maintain sidewalks on their property. All lifted and cracked sidewalks require repair at the homeowner's expense.

TREES

It is the homeowner's responsibility to prune and maintain trees located on their property. Also, **no tree in the common ground, or wildlife corridor, may be pruned, removed, or topped for any purpose, including installation of solar panels.** Trees in these areas needing attention should be brought to the attention of the *Common Ground Trees Committee*.

OTHER IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Parking/storage of inoperable, unregistered, or uninsured motor vehicles, boats, or any other watercrafts, trailers, and/or recreational vehicles are not allowed anywhere on your property or Common Grounds.
- **Berkeley Township Ordinance:** Trash/garbage is to be put out at the curb **AFTER 4:00pm** on the day before a scheduled pickup. RECYCLED ITEMS are to be placed curbside, in reusable containers or paper bags, **AFTER 5:00pm** on the day before a scheduled pickup.
- All pets are required to be leashed. You must pick up and remove your pet's waste, even if you walk them in the common ground area.
- It is the Homeowner's responsibility to maintain their grass and/or stone lawns.
- **A Berkeley Township Ordinance strictly prohibits the feeding of wild animals** consisting of, but not limiting to, the following: DEER, rabbits, squirrels, chipmunks, and groundhogs. Wild birds are excluded.

Silver Ridge Park North Shed Rules

After discussion regarding sheds at the Silver Ridge Park North (SRPN) Trustee meeting, held on Tuesday, April 7, 2015, the Trustees unanimously agreed to Rules 1-8. Updated Permit/Form information - February 2019.

1. In keeping with Berkeley Township's Shed Ordinance, homeowners are permitted, effective this date, to install one (1) shed on their property; up to and including 120 square feet (10 ft. x 12 ft.);
2. Said shed may be of any structure material the homeowner desires;
3. Sheds that are required to be fastened must be on a firm ground structure. DO NOT place any shed on a cement slab. Cement slabs add square feet to your taxable living space and will be taxable by Berkeley Township;
4. Sheds may NOT be installed on any Common Ground Property;
5. In accordance with Berkeley Township Ordinance, sheds must be placed at least three (3) feet from the back property line and at least (3) feet from the side property line;
6. If a homeowner chooses to install a shed adjacent to their home, it may NOT block any windows or doors;
7. Homeowners MUST submit an Architectural Approval Request form to the SRPN Architectural Committee. *Architectural Approval Request forms are available in the SRPN Clubhouse Lobby;*
8. The homeowner MUST submit a **Zoning Permit Application**, required fees, and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall/Zoning Office. *Zoning Permit Application forms can be obtained from the Berkeley Township Website or Zoning Office.*

STILL PAYING IT FORWARD WITH “IMPORTANT NEWS” U.S. Government Phasing Out Paper Check By Year Ending 2026

The Internal Revenue Service, as well as other government agencies, began phasing out payments by paper check as of September 30, 2025. The IRS will publish guidance for taxpayers before the 2026 tax season begins. The government's goal is ‘NO PAPER CHECKS’ by the end of 2026 for ALL payouts.

- Individuals who receive payments from the US Government (*social security, pensions, tax refunds, etc.*) will be **REQUIRED** to establish a means **direct deposit** to a bank or a financial institution.
- For tax year 2025, filed in 2026, paper checks will be issued not earlier than six weeks from the filing/payment date. And for those taxpayers who file a Paper Tax Return, processing could take up to six months before a check is issued.

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO NOW –

1. If feasible, open a bank account and provide your tax preparer and payees (social security, post office/gov’t retiree, etc.) with the bank routing number and your account number.
IMPORTANT NOTE: Except for a married couple, no checks can be deposited into a joint account. *For security purposes, financial institutions will be instructed to return checks if they are deposited into a joint account whose co-owner is not the spouse.* In this case, you may want to open a separate account for the direct deposit with the same financial institution; this will allow you to transfer the funds between both accounts.
2. Contact Your Government Check Paying Agencies and follow their instructions. A list can be found at the website – **GoDirect.gov/gpw/paying-agencies**
3. The **Treasury Electronic Payment Solution Center** will offer alternative methods for receiving funds in lieu of a standard bank account. You may consider signing up for a **Direct Express Debit Card** (*which accepts deposits similar to the way the SNAP Program does*). Call the Center Mon – Fri, 8 AM-8 PM at 800-967-6857.
4. Website - **GoDirect.gov** outlines the provisions of paperless disbursement of funds and also offers alternative ways to receive them.

STILL PAYING IT FORWARD

Maintaining You Vehicle's Battery

The battery that powers your vehicle has three enemies: (1) Summer Heat, (2) Below Freezing Temperatures in the Winter, and (3) Using Accessories without running the vehicle.

Most vehicle batteries are self-contained (not having to add fluids). This has helped increase the life of vehicle batteries if you follow these precautions –

1. Before turning off your vehicle, turn off ALL accessories. This limits the amount of power drained when you go to start the vehicle.
2. If a Key Fob is used to start your vehicle, make sure you do NOT store it in a Key Rack just inside the door from where your car is parked. The vehicle's system is in 'Standby Mode' and is constantly searching for a signal. This not only uses your vehicle's battery power but also drains the power in the Key Fob's battery.
3. Usually, if the vehicle is NOT going to be driven for more than a month, you should disconnect the BLACK CABLE from the battery. However, check your Vehicle Manual's Battery Replacement instructions for procedures. An exception to that practice is if the Control Module needs to be reset if battery power is lost. DO NOT disconnect the battery in VOLKSWAGON manufactured vehicles.
4. Even if garaged, ALWAYS lock your vehicle. Your anti-theft system draws more power when the vehicle is unlocked. With the vehicle turned off, a blinking dashboard light always stays blinking but draws virtually no power with the vehicle locked.
5. If you have a Remote Start System, try to drive the vehicle for a minimum of 30 minutes before parking it permanently. Heater systems draw a tremendous amount of power and idling does not charge the battery adequately - it needs to be driven.
6. When having your oil changed, ask the mechanic to check your battery. If you frequent a private garage on a regular basis, they will usually perform that test at no charge, if you ask.
7. As mentioned in number 3 above, ALWAYS check your Vehicle's Manual for proper procedures for battery replacement. Some manufacturers make it impossible for your local mechanic to routinely replace a battery. Your manual will probably tell you that it must be replaced by the Dealer. If the battery quits unexpectedly, the cost of a tow may be necessary.
8. Consider purchasing Roadside Assistance. You can get it from your vehicle's Insurance Policy Provider, Consumer Cellular and some Credit Card Companies may provide the service at a minimal or no cost as a perk for members.

Following the above recommendations can help you avoid the inconvenience of a dead battery along with the unnecessary costs involved.

The night before, dad showed me, in the dining room with the lights off, how to carefully load the film. I made sure the sprockets lined up with the holes in the film so it would ‘catch’ to advance after each picture taken. Ooooh, I couldn’t wait to start snapping pictures!

Mrs. Mason had her fidgety 3rd grade students lined up and ready to board the bus in the Roosevelt School parking lot, right on time. Rolling her eyes, she obviously regretted asking the class, “*Does anyone have to use the lavatory before we leave?*” when ten kids raised their hands. But eventually, we were in our seats, bladders were empty, and we were on our way to see Lady Liberty. I remember feeling so grown up; being on the bus without my bossy sister and neither of us having to rein Eddie in, from running in the aisle.

As I sat holding my camera, I imagined that one of my photographs would be worthy of the next LIFE Magazine cover. I even had an extra roll of film in my pocket just so the LIFE Magazine people could have a bunch of pictures to choose from.

The minute we got on the ferry, I began taking candid shots of my friends talking to each other and goofing around; like Anthony holding his fingers up behind Jill’s head (*giving her horns*) and Jimmy sticking straws in his nose. And there were scenic pictures too; the Statue of Liberty in the distance, looking about six inches big. Soon, she was standing right there in front of us, so tall, with her torch held up

high against the crystal blue sky. It was an awesome sight I’ll never forget.

Once we were on Liberty Island, Mrs. Mason had us line up (we did a lot of lining up in 3rd grade) and we entered the ground floor of the statue where there was a massive spiral staircase.

“*If there’s ANYONE who thinks they can’t climb to the top, tell me NOW, because you cannot turn around to come down, once you begin.*” Wait. What? My hand went up like a shot, along with a few other kids, and I heard the class-bully yell, “*Chicken!*” as we left the statue. The ‘chickens’ headed for the park area to have an early lunch.

About a half-hour later, our sweaty-pale-dehydrated classmates joined us from their climb, complaining; “*Man, what a waste! The head was closed so we climbed up there for nothin’!*”

I couldn’t muster any bad feelings for him and didn’t even try to hide my grin as I listened, while eating my sandwich (*salami on potato chips, with mayo, on Wonder bread*) ... my “salami-breath” was going to be my own sweet revenge for that ‘Chicken’ comment!

Soon we were lined up for the bus (*again with the lining up!*) and we were on our way home. I kept thinking about all the great photos I’d taken that day and couldn’t wait to see them.

Almost a week passed before my pictures were ready to be picked up. (*What I would have given for an iPhone back then!*) My dad walked in from work and handed me the photo envelope. As we sat at the dinner table, one by one, I leafed through the photographs as I told my uninterested-family a story relating to each picture.

And then ... “*Wait. What is this? I didn’t take these!*” Slowly I turned my head and looked at my brother. “*YOU took these!*” Yup, good ol’ Eddie had gotten a hold of my camera and took three pictures, and all he had to say for himself was, “*Ooo, let me see the ones I took!*” ... these were his photos:

One picture was of our dog, sleeping on his back on the couch. He also took a picture of our bathroom toilet – Why? Who knows – it was Eddie!

Then, there was his last picture; it was a simple, but beautiful, candid shot of my mom and dad in our chaotic kitchen, smiling at each other ... and it was worthy of the next LIFE Magazine cover.

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OCEAN RIDE ~ Reserve-A-Ride Program

Ocean County Transportation Services Department

Ocean Ride is a service for seniors (age 60 and over) and/or persons with disabilities (age 18 and over) on an advanced reservation basis *primarily* to destinations within Ocean County.

- Pre-registration is NOT required. Simply call to make your reservation when you have your appointment's date, time, and location. Trip cost/fare, and more information, can be found on the website listed at the bottom of this article.
- **Call Ocean Ride ~ Reserve-A-Ride Monday through Friday ONLY - 8:15 AM to 4:15 PM to make your trip reservation.**
- We accept trip reservations on a "first-come - first serve" basis, up to four (4) weeks in advance.
- **All trip reservation requests are handled by telephone only;**
Call (732) 736-8989 - then press "1" to speak with a Trip Reservationist.
- The Reserve-A-Ride Program is primarily designed to serve routine medical needs of Ocean County residents. Unlike the Fixed Bus Routes, this service does not operate on the basis of a printed schedule, rather routes and pick-up times are developed each day in response to the service requests we receive.
- **All vehicles are wheelchair lift equipped.**
- Reserve-A-Ride Round Trips: \$6.00 (Riders with Attendants, each pay \$6.00 per Round Trip)
- Once your reservation has been made, the driver will arrive anytime within 1 hour to 1½ hours of the scheduled appointment time, depending on your travel distance.

In accordance with Ocean Ride's Safety Policy, **our Drivers are NOT permitted to enter your home, thus we require that you be at Ground Level for your scheduled pick up.**


