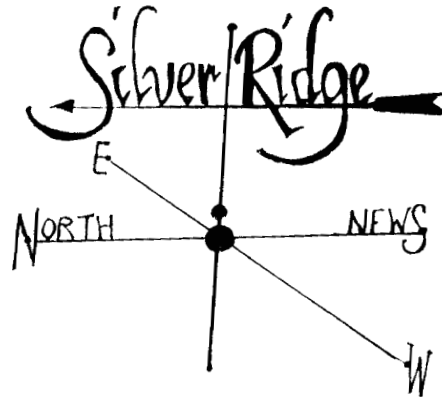

What is an Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR)?

The N.J. Condominium Act requires that community associations "provide a fair and efficient procedure for the resolution of disputes between individual unit owners and the association, and between unit owners, which shall be readily available as an alternative to litigation." In short, it is mandatory for every homeowner association within the State of N.J. to provide and maintain an effective ADR program.

How do I Request an ADR?

- An ADR Complainant Mediation Packet can be obtained at the HOA Office.
- The Complainant should complete the packet and forwarded by email to the Coalition ADR Coordinator, hereafter known as Coordinator. If you cannot do email, place your documents in a sealed envelope. Write your name across the sealed flap and deliver it to your HOA office and have them contact the Coordinator for pick up
- To preserve the integrity and privacy of your request for an ADR, DO NOT send any supporting documentation at this time.
- Your assigned mediator will be in touch with you.

Petitions opposing A3346 and S791

A-3466: Sponsored by Assemblywoman Lopez (19th District)

- Requires associations of age-restricted common interest communities to permit dwelling owners to transfer property without regard to age of buyer.
- At least one occupant of the dwelling must be at least 55 years of age to comply with the Housing of Older Persons Act (HOPA).

S791: Sponsored by Robert Singer (30th District)

- Prohibits common interest communities from penalizing member who place unit into living, revocable trust fund or classifying placement as title transfer.

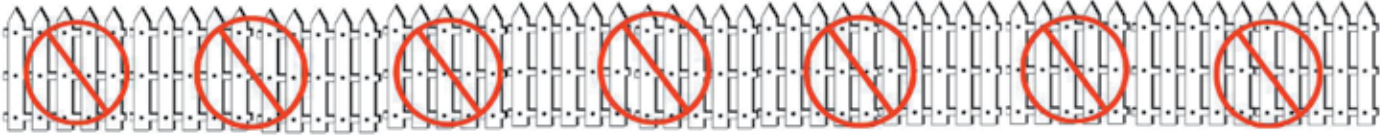

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

S R P NORTH HOMEOWNERS

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Prior to obtaining a permit from the Berkeley Township Construction Office and/or Zoning Office, homeowners must obtain a "Architectural Approval Request" form from the *Architectural Committee*. **Sheds, upgrades, renovations, repairs, additions, exterior changes, anything pertain to the grounds, trees, driveway construction and sidewalks all require approval from the Architectural Committee.** **Note:** Homeowners may need to submit a Zoning Permit Application, required fees, and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall/Zoning Office. Contact the Zoning Office for instructions.

COMMON GROUNDS

No debris, grass cuttings, landscape material, leaves, old plants, tree branches should be dumped in the common grounds. **Violators are subject to Berkeley Township fines.**

LAWS GOVERNING S R P NORTH

Mandatory Federal, NJ State, Berkeley Township Laws, SRPN Association Covenant-Restrictions and By-Laws and Robert Rules are instruments of the rule of law that the sitting Board of Trustees must follow to meet their obligations.

- Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (Federal Fair Housing Act)
- The Housing for Older Persons Act (HOPA)
- NJ State Public Law #L90-284 and PUB 100L430 Guidelines for the operation of senior communities.
- Berkeley Township Ordinance #118-1625. The establishment of a planned residential community for older adults. • Silver Ridge Park North's Covenants and Restrictions/By-Laws.
- State of New Jersey Full Disclosure Act and Regulations Title #5.

SELLING/RENTING OF HOMES

When selling your home, either on your own or through a Real Estate Agent, you must notify the HOA **BEFORE** your buyer completes the 'New Purchaser's Packet' and provide the HOA with two (2) forms of identification; one being a photo ID showing birthdates for each occupant of the home. (See pg.2 for appt. information) **SRPN By-Laws require one (1) year homeowner's ownership prior to renting their property.**

Landlords AND Tenants must complete the HOA's 'Lease Agreement Packet' and provide the HOA with two (2) forms of identification; one being a photo I.D. showing birthdates for **each occupant and a copy of the Lease.**

All buyers and tenants (all residents) **must appear in person** at the HOA office with the required identification and paperwork. **Berkeley Township will not issue a C.O. (Certificate of Occupancy) without the HOA's Letter stating the buyer/tenants are in good standing with the Homeowners Association.**

SIDEWALKS

It is each homeowner's responsibility to repair and maintain sidewalks on their property. All lifted and cracked sidewalks require repair at the homeowner's expense.

TREES

It is the homeowner's responsibility to prune and maintain trees located on their property. Also, **no tree in the common ground, or wildlife corridor, may be pruned, removed, or topped for any purpose, including installation of solar panels.** Trees in these areas needing attention should be brought to the attention of the *Common Ground Trees Committee*.

OTHER IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Parking/storage of inoperable, unregistered, or uninsured motor vehicles, boats, or any other watercrafts, trailers, and/or recreational vehicles are not allowed anywhere on your property or Common Grounds.
- **Berkeley Township Ordinance:** Robo Trash Cans are to be placed in the street/curbside **AFTER 4:00pm** on the day before a scheduled pickup. Robo Recycle Cans are to be placed in the street/curbside **AFTER 5:00pm** on the day before a scheduled pick up.
- **ALL pets are required to be leashed. You must pick up and remove your pet's waste, even if you walk them in the common ground area.**
- It is the Homeowner's responsibility to maintain their own grass and/or stone lawns.
- **A Berkeley Township Ordinance strictly prohibits the feeding of wild animals** consisting of, but not limiting to, the following: DEER, rabbits, squirrels, chipmunks, and groundhogs. Wild birds are excluded.

Silver Ridge Park North Shed Rules

After discussion regarding sheds at the Silver Ridge Park North (SRPN) Trustee meeting, held on Tuesday, April 7, 2015, the Trustees unanimously agreed to Rules 1-8. Updated Permit/Form information - February 2019.

1. In keeping with Berkeley Township's Shed Ordinance, homeowners are permitted, effective this date, to install one (1) shed on their property; up to and including 120 square feet (10 ft. x 12 ft.);
2. Said shed may be of any structure material the homeowner desires;
3. Sheds that are required to be fastened must be on a firm ground structure. DO NOT place any shed on a cement slab. Cement slabs add square feet to your taxable living space and will be taxable by Berkeley Township;
4. Sheds may NOT be installed on any Common Ground Property;
5. In accordance with Berkeley Township Ordinance, sheds must be placed at least three (3) feet from the back property line and at least (3) feet from the side property line;
6. If a homeowner chooses to install a shed adjacent to their home, it may NOT block any windows or doors;
7. Homeowners MUST submit an Architectural Approval Request form to the SRPN Architectural Committee. *Architectural Approval Request forms are available in the SRPN Clubhouse Lobby;*
8. The homeowner MUST submit a **Zoning Permit Application**, required fees, and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall/Zoning Office. *Zoning Permit Application forms can be obtained from the Berkeley Township Website or Zoning Office.*

STILL PAYING IT FORWARD Our National Colors – The Symbol of Our Democracy

Flag Day is the fourteenth of June each year. It commemorates the adoption of the American flag in 1776. While it is not an official holiday, President Wilson issued a proclamation in 1916 declaring it a day of observance. While our nation's symbol is readily identifiable, its design has several meanings and protocols that are unknown to many.

- The thirteen stripes represent the number of Original Colonies.
- The color red represents Valor and Bravery.
- The white represents Purity and Innocence .
- The blue represents Vigilance, Perseverance and Justice.
- The most recent modification was in 1960 when Hawaii joined the Union.
- The first make-shift flag (referred to as The Grand Union Flag) was hoisted over Prospect Hill in Boston while the city was under siege by George Washington on January 1, 1776. Its depiction was a series of thirteen alternating red and white stripes with the United Kingdom's Flag in the top left corner.
- There is much controversy surrounding the allegation that Betsy Ross designed the flag as we see it today. But after The Post Office Department researched the Library of Congress for answers, it began issuing stamps; the first being a three-cent stamp in 1952 commemorating Betsy Ross.
- When flown, the Union (blue field w/50 stars) is always positioned in the top left corner.
- It should never be displayed as a garment (shirt, pants, etc.) or seat covering.
- Flying the flag upside down is never acceptable, except in times of DISTRESS.
- A torn or disheveled flag should be lowered immediately and properly disposed of.

There are many more interesting facts relating to the design and protocols of the American Flag. A little research on Flag Day, by our citizens, would lend credence to its creation.

2026 SRPN POOL BADGE PRICES

Homeowner Badges (Occupants on the Deed) COST: \$100.00 each

- Homeowner Badges are red.
- Badges for Homeowners on the Deed are valid for as long as the current Homeowner's name(s) appears on the Deed's title.
- **Maximum - two (2) Badges per household.**
- Homeowner Badges are never transferrable.
- **Homeowner Badges need to be surrendered to the HOA Office upon transfer of Deed title and/or when the Homeowner is no longer residing in the home.**

Associate Badges (Occupants not on the Deed) COST: \$100.00 each

- Associate badges are light blue.
- Associates are Occupants who are not Homeowners but reside, on a full-time basis, in the home. **Tenants (Renters) are Associates.**
- Badges for Associates are valid for as long as the Occupant is residing, on a full-time basis, in the home.
- Associate Badges are never transferrable.
- **Associate Badges need to be surrendered to the HOA Office when the Occupant is no longer residing in the home.**

Seasonal Guest Wristlets COST: \$15.00 each

- Each dwelling/household is permitted to purchase up to six (6) Guest Wristlets each year (Pool Season).
- **NEW Guest Wristlets may be purchased each year (Pool Season) and are VALID ONLY FOR THAT POOL SEASON.**
- Guest Wristlets are transferrable during the year (Pool Season) in which they were purchased.

***** IMPORTANT INFORMATION *****

- **ALL RESIDENTS MUST PRESENT THEIR OWN POOL BADGE WHEN PURCHASING SEASONAL GUEST WRISTLETS.**

SRPN 2026 POOL & POOL AREA RULES

1. Pool hours are from 10:00 – 7:00 p.m. The Pool can be open seven (7) days.
2. Children under the age of four (4) OR in diapers are NOT allowed to enter the Pool Area. Children Swim Hours are 10 AM – 12 NOON and 4 PM – 6 PM. All children under the age of sixteen (16) must have adult supervision.
3. The Pool will be closed if a Pool Monitor is not available.
4. The use of the Pool / Pool Area is for the sole use of Silver Ridge Park North Residents and their Guests.
5. If it rains intermittently all day, the Pool will be closed. If it rains in the morning, and the sun comes out in the afternoon, the Pool may remain closed if there are no Pool Monitors available to open.
6. No one is permitted in the Pool Area when the Pool is closed.
7. At least two (2) people must be in the Pool Area to use the Pool. **Do NOT swim alone.**
8. All Residents and their Guests must sign in with their name, address, telephone number and must present their Badge and/or Wristlet to the Pool Monitor on duty each time of entry. **No exceptions.**
9. **Glass containers and Alcohol are never permitted in the Pool Area.**
10. Running, jumping, and diving are not permitted.
11. Appropriate behavior and language are always expected in and around the Pool. Profanity, lude comments and unruly behavior will not be tolerated at any time.
12. Personal “noodles”, “noodle-slings” and weights are the only aquatic items permitted in the Pool / Pool Area.
13. By order of the Board of Health, no pets, except service animals for the disabled, are permitted in the Pool / Pool Area.
14. The Board of Health requires you to shower before entering the Pool.
15. Bathing caps, or hair restraints, must be worn in the Pool when hair length is below the shoulders.
16. Feet must be covered when walking in the Pool Area and when using the Rest Rooms.
17. Personal radios must be at a volume that is not disturbing to others.
18. Do not move the tables. Chairs may be moved only within the designated areas.
19. Please stay home if you are sick.
20. Facility Supervisors are the final authority on questions or interpretation of the rules and regulations listed. This includes conduct, decorum, dress, and admission to the Pool / Pool Area.

2026 NEW JERSEY STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

By order of the New Jersey State Board of Health, the following State Regulations apply:

1. If a Pool Monitor is not on duty, the Pool is closed.
 2. People with communicable diseases, colds, nasal drip, skin disorders, or bandages, are not allowed in the Pool.
 3. Showering is required before entering the Pool.
 4. Bare feet are **NOT ALLOWED** in the Restrooms or in the Pool Area unless in the water.
 5. During Pool Season, no entrance to the Clubhouse beyond the Rest Rooms is permitted.
 6. Any person showing excessive sunburn, open blisters, cuts, or bandages shall be denied admission to the Pool Area.
 7. If you feel sick, please STAY HOME.
 8. Do not enter the water if you are experiencing, or recovering from, diarrhea or have signs, or symptoms, of gastrointestinal (stomach) disease within the past seven (7) days.
 9. Children should be encouraged to use the Restroom before entering the water. Children must be potty-trained to be in the Pool Area.
 10. You are prohibited, during an electric storm, to be in the water.
 11. Persons suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be prohibited from entering the Pool Area.
 12. Persons being obnoxious will be escorted out of the Pool Area.

Drive Sensibly ...

STILL PAYING IT FORWARD



and SAVE MONEY

As we all know, the price of gasoline has skyrocketed in recent weeks but driving habits can help you get the maximum number of miles out of each gallon. **Here are some facts:**

- Speeds in excess of 65 miles an hour can consume 10% more gas.
- Highway driving at a constant speed (cruise control) saves gas.
- Slow acceleration from a stop saves gas as you get up to speed.
- Avoid excessive braking. In many cases, merely taking your foot off of the accelerator will sufficiently adjust your speed.
- Do not tailgate the car in front of you. You should, at a minimum, be able to see where the rear tires meet the road. This will help avoid excessive braking.
- When approaching stopped traffic, taking your foot off of the gas will usually allow you to slow down enough to minimize braking.
- Hard acceleration and braking can often reduce your mileage by 3 miles per gallon.
- If your car is so equipped, DO NOT turn off the stop/start system. Contrary to popular belief, this system does not excessively wear out your starter and used in heavy traffic, can save over 3 miles per gallon.
- Remove transport items/racks when not in use. They not only reduce weight but air drag as well.
- Try to fill up at the half full mark. It will not only save you time and fuel searching for a gas station but avoids the debris and moisture accumulation on the bottom from mixing with the fuel. Pick a station and fill up when you are in the area.
- Try to use TOP TIER FUEL. Go to **CR.org/toptiergas** for a list of companies. Usually, those stations providing top tier fuel sticker on the pump. Using off brand gasoline actually can harm the longevity of your car's engine. It may cost more, in some cases, but well worth it in the long run.
- Unless your car manual specifically requires it, using premium gas is a waste of money.
- Look for discounts. Linking credit cards to specific brands can provide substantial savings, and paying cash can sometimes save you about ten percent.

Practicing safe and sensible driving habits not only saves fuel but reduces your chances of getting into an accident.

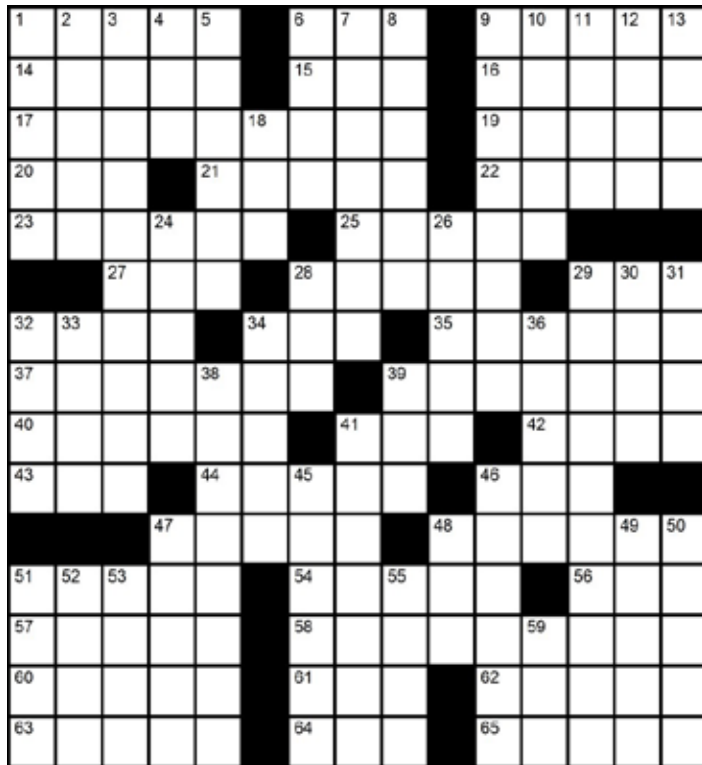

OCEAN RIDE ~ Reserve-A-Ride Program

Ocean County Transportation Services Department

Ocean Ride is a service for seniors (age 60 and over) and/or persons with disabilities (age 18 and over) on an advanced reservation basis *primarily* to destinations within Ocean County.

- Pre-registration is NOT required. Simply call to make your reservation when you have your appointment's date, time, and location. Trip cost/fare, and more information, can be found on the website listed at the bottom of this article.
- **Call Ocean Ride ~ Reserve-A-Ride Monday through Friday ONLY - 8:15 AM to 4:15 PM to make your trip reservation.**
- We accept trip reservations on a "first-come - first serve" basis, up to four (4) weeks in advance.
- **All trip reservation requests are handled by telephone only;**
Call (732) 736-8989 - then press "1" to speak with a Trip Reservationist.
- The Reserve-A-Ride Program is primarily designed to serve routine medical needs of Ocean County residents. Unlike the Fixed Bus Routes, this service does not operate on the basis of a printed schedule, rather routes and pick-up times are developed each day in response to the service requests we receive.
- **All vehicles are wheelchair lift equipped.**
- Reserve-A-Ride Round Trips: \$6.00 (Riders with Attendants, each pay \$6.00 per Round Trip)
- Once your reservation has been made, the driver will arrive anytime within 1 hour to 1½ hours of the scheduled appointment time, depending on your travel distance.

In accordance with Ocean Ride's Safety Policy, **our Drivers are NOT permitted to enter your home, thus we require that you be at Ground Level for your scheduled pick up.**

**** Riders will be billed via mail, the month AFTER service. ****

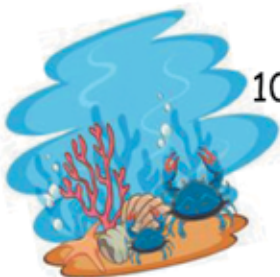
